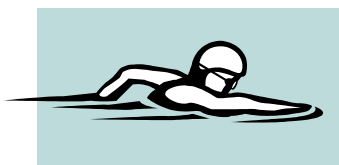

To see which titles are already available, search the Library's online catalog by keyword for "kindle." These titles remain accessible on all of the Library Kindles. There is a limit of one Amazon book download per three-week Kindle loan.

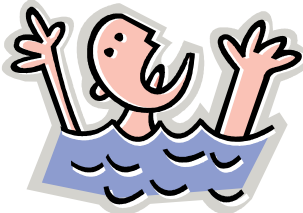

A trimmer catalog for mobile library-users, AirPAC, will bring the library catalog to you whether you are riding a bus, waiting for a class to start, browsing a bookstore or library stacks, or on the shore in your snazzy Jantzen suit. AirPAC software provides modern features like RightResult™ relevance-ranking, cover images, and links to external resources. It also integrates library locations with built-in Google Maps™ software, lends full support for requesting options, access to online resources and electronic journals, and the currently available My Library Account access for online renewals and hold requests.

AirPAC supports the iPhone™, BlackBerry® Storm™, Palm® Pre™, and Google's Android™ OS phones.

## Europeana: digital artifacts

This lovely 1930s creation is part of Edinburgh, Scotland's East Lothian Museums Service. Searching in *Europeana* by the keyword of "swimsuit" retrieves this and more vintage examples of beach fashion.

*Europeana* is a project of the European Union that is a database of the museum collections of **Rijksmuseum** in Amsterdam, the **British Library** in London and the **Louvre** in Paris and many more. Its 6 million digital items include images - paintings, drawings, maps, photos and swimsuits of course; texts such as books, newspapers, letters, diaries and manuscripts; sounds files of music and spoken word from cylinders, tapes, discs and radio broadcasts; and films, newsreels and TV broadcasts.

The Library has six FlipVideo camcorders that patrons can borrow for a five-day loan at the Media Services desk. They are compatible with both Mac and PC, have 120 minutes of recording time and 4G of memory. Record, pause, play, and delete with one button; they are that easy to use.

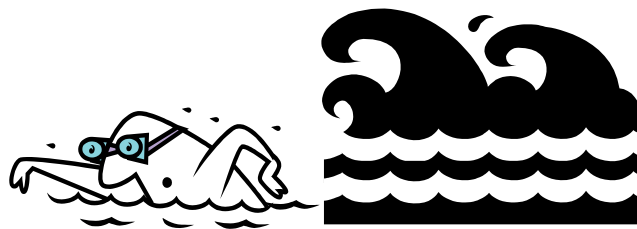
The slide-down USB port plugs into your computer in order to open Flipshare to edit videos and to save them or share them online by uploading to YouTube, Facebook, and others.

Using the TV connection cable included, connect the Flip to your television to view there. Batteries are also included, but you *might* need an extra set of AAs.

## Drown-Free Zone

Besides deep breathing and exercise, here are some tips to get through crunch time according to the librarians.

### RefWorks & Write 'n Cite

Learn these tools now before you gather sources and start writing a research paper. RefWorks is your own private database of references that you can export from your database searches, such as Academic Search Elite and the library catalog. Write 'N Cite works with Microsoft Word and RefWorks to facilitate the citing process within the text and for the list at the end of the paper.

Even if you only use RefWorks, and skip using Write 'N Cite, you will be ahead of the frustration game with the list of references at the end of the paper. RefWorks will create the list of the cites in a RefWorks folder in any style your professor might require—APA, ASA, MLA, or Chicago Manual of Style to name some of the most common.

### Appointment with a Librarian

A librarian can spot an inappropriate source a mile away. Have one look over the sources you are using. Allow him or her to help you search for more sources or better ones. Librarians can help you avoid the error of omission of failing to cite the top scholars in the field who have researched what you are studying.

### Help 24/7

The Library's virtual reference service allows students to chat

with a librarian at all hours of the day and share screens within databases. Several of the Jesuit colleges' librarians team up to staff this service round the clock to help with any type of reference question. Look for the blue icon on our home page.

## LibGuides Bring Web 2.0 Subject & Course Guides

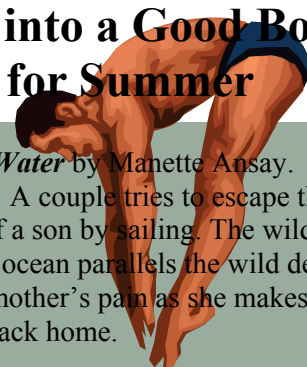
This spring the library created subject specific research guides using the web 2.0 publishing platform [LibGuides](#). Over 1,000 libraries in 22 countries are currently using the powerful program to create multimedia research guides that share information and promote library resources to their communities.

At Le Moyne College, librarians have already created 44 guides that are accessible via the Library's web site by clicking on the [Subject Guides](#) tab on the home page. These guides are customizable and can be updated with new information and resources as they are needed. LibGuides make it easy for students to access multiple library resources on a specific subject from one place. They can search the catalog for books, access databases to find journal articles, browse recommended web sites, watch videos, keep up with current trends by reading RSS feeds, and even get online

help from a librarian if they need it. Users of LibGuides can provide feedback directly to the guide creators, and can also recommend web sites or other resources be added to the guides, creating a collaborative space for learning.

Librarians are also working with academic departments to create specialized course guides that include resources tailored to specific assignments. For example, the History 102 course guide contains a section devoted to recommended primary sources about the Holocaust, which is a required element for their research paper. There are course guides for Biology, History, and Human Resource Management, and more are under construction as needed. Faculty can request course guides be created for their courses by contacting the [librarian that specializes in their subject area](#).

## Dive into a Good Book for Summer



**Blue Water** by Manette Ansay. [\[excerpt\]](#) A couple tries to escape the loss of a son by sailing. The wildness of the ocean parallels the wild depths of a mother's pain as she makes her way back home.

**Gardens of Water** by Alan Drew. [\[excerpt\]](#) Set near Istanbul, this is a twist on the familiar Romeo and Juliet love of two teens. Two families—one Kurdish and Muslim, one American and Christian—are forced together after a devastating earthquake.

**Girl with the Dragon Tattoo** by Stieg Larsson. The disappearance of a young scion of one of the wealthiest families in Stockholm, gnaws at an uncle, who hires a crusading journalist to investigate. Assisting him is a 24-year-old, pierced, tattooed genius hacker. This unlikely team discovers family secrets and astonishing corruption in Swedish industrialism—and a surprising connection between themselves

**Head Above Water** by S.L. Rottman Skye tries to find the time for both family obligations and personal interests, which include caring for her brother who has Down Syndrome, dating her first boyfriend, and swimming competitively. (youth lit.)

**Wild Romance** by Chloë Schama [\[author speaks\]](#) Schama stumbled across the idea for this book in the British Library, where she was supposed to be researching Victorian "sensation novels." Instead, she found a true-life sensational tale of the 1860s: the "Yelverton Bigamy Trial."
