The Achievement Program for Le Moyne College Undergraduate Students (A-PLUS) was developed to prepare students for professional licensure, graduate school, or to enter careers in the fields of social sciences and the humanities. Funded by the Booth Ferris Foundation, the program provides historically underrepresented, economically disadvantaged, and first generation students opportunities to enter their target professions.



Eligibility

- Historically underrepresented (by race, ethnicity), economically disadvantaged or first generation college student.
- A full time student (12 or more credit hours / semester)
- Intend to pursue a major/career in the social science or humanity fields

Students who do not meet the above criteria may be admitted on a probationary basis subject to A-PLUS oversight and review.

Requirements

- Maintain a grade-point average of 3.0 or above
- Meet with A-PLUS staff three times each semester
- Participate in weekly seminars
- Develop and maintain an academic plan
- Complete research projects or other enrichment activities as outlined by the program
