





The first week of your immersion includes a combination of coursework, orientation programming, time to gather with your orientation group, and fun activities. Each weekday will have a similar schedule so that you can get comfortable with a routine and know exactly where you need to be and when.

Much will revolve around your COR 100 class. If you are taking COR 100 in the morning (beginning either at 9 a.m. or 9:30 a.m.) then your orientation activity, held each weekday for one hour, will take place in the afternoon along with set time to gather with your orientation group and work on COR 100 assignments. If you are taking COR 100 in the afternoon (beginning either at 1 p.m. or 1:30 p.m.) then your orientation activity, held each weekday for one hour, will take place in the morning along with set time to gather with your orientation group and work on COR 100

assignments. Your orientation group will be made up of students from your COR 100 class. This not only means that you get to know each other better and can work on homework together (yes, there will be homework for COR 100), but that you will also reduce the risk of exposure to COVID-19 by staying with the same group of students.

You can access your tentative course schedule at phinfo.lemoyne.edu. Please note that some minor schedule changes for fall are still underway. Students' schedules should be final by August 31. In the meantime, use this information to prepare for the weeks ahead.

In person (F2F) courses: You will meet exclusively in person, unless your professor tells you otherwise. Check Phinfo for the room location.

Online (DIST) courses: You will meet exclusively online. These courses are typically synchronous meaning that you must log in at the specific day/time each class is held. At times, you may find that your professor has assigned you independent work such as watching a video lecture or completing online work. Your professor will explain the expectations of the course. Be prepared to use Canvas heavily.

Hybrid (HYB) courses: You will meet on some weeks in person and other weeks virtually. In Phinfo, check what the course number is for each of your courses, e.g., HST 110. If your course is a 100 level or 400 level (but we don't expect that you will have any 400 level classes), you will meet in person on odd weeks and virtually on even weeks. If you have any 200 level or 300 level courses on your schedule then you will meet virtually on odd weeks and in person on even weeks. Use the chart below to help you remember. Since today starts week 1 of the real fall semester, you will attend your 100 level hybrid courses in person. In addition, depending on how many students are in your class, your professor may split you up even further. So watch your email closely for a message from your faculty.




