

## Students Testing and Other Information

All students must be tested before their commencement. Students can get tested on campus (information below) or they have the option of getting a PCR test within 72 hours of the ceremony time or obtain their own rapid test within six hours of the ceremony.

The College uses the NAVICA app for test results. If you have never used the NAVICA app, download the app and set up your account prior to arriving on campus. Download the NAVICA app from the [App Store](#) [Apple devices] and the [Google Play Store](#) [Android devices] and set up your account.

**For all testing, students must enter the testing site through the Recreation Center front door.** Students must present a green badge on their Campus Clear app when checking in for testing.

### Undergraduate 2020 Ceremony (Saturday, May 22)

- If attending the 10 a.m. ceremony, graduates with last names A to M, should test between 7 and 8 a.m. and graduates with last names N to Z should test between 8 and 9 a.m.
- If attending the 2 p.m. ceremony, graduates with last names A to M, should test between 11 a.m. and noon and graduates with last names N to Z should test between noon and 1 p.m.

### Honors Convocation and Baccalaureate Mass

- Testing will be open between 7 a.m. to 3 p.m.

### Graduate 2020 and 2021 (Thursday, May 27)

- Test between 2 and 6:30 p.m. It is recommended that people test *early to avoid long lines*.

### Undergraduate 2021 Ceremony (Friday, May 28)

- If attending the 10 a.m. ceremony, graduates with last names A to M, should test between 7 and 8 a.m. and graduates with last names N to Z should test between 8 and 9 a.m.
- If attending the 2 p.m. ceremony, graduates with last names A to M, should test between 11 a.m. and noon and graduates with last names N to Z should test between noon and 1 p.m.

## **#Campus Clear Screening**

The College is utilizing the health screening app - #CampusClear - to facilitate health screening of students, faculty and staff for its commencement ceremonies. All those with a [lemoyne.edu](mailto:lemoyne.edu) email address who will be physically present on campus for commencement will be required to utilize #CampusClear.

## **Other Information**

- After students receive a negative COVID test result, they will be given a bracelet that allows them access to the ceremony site.
- If students took a test elsewhere that meets the necessary guidelines, they should still come to the student testing site to have their documentation reviewed.
- Students should not bring personal items to commencement as there will be nowhere to store these items.
- Students will not be allowed to shake hands with the President when accepting their diploma.
- Students may temporarily remove their face mask after exiting the stage and having their individual photo taken. The mask must be put back on before returning to their seat.
