- 4. The following prerequisite courses must be completed within the past five years: one semester of Anatomy & Physiology with lab; Neuroscience or Brain and Behavior; Lifespan or Human Development (see details in the list below); Abnormal Psychology
- 5. Cumulative GPA of at least 3.0.
- 6. At least 30 clinical observation hours under the supervision of a licensed OT in multiple settings with different clients.
