
## LE MOYNE Greatness meets Goodness

## Ignatian Award, Honorary Alumnus/a

The Ignatian Award, Honorary Alumnus/Alumna, is bestowed upon a community member who, though not a Le Moyne graduate, exemplifies the spirit of being a Dolphin. ## 2025 Recipient - Helen Dillon



Through her enduring commitment to the legacy of her late husband, John "Jack" Boorman '63, Helen J. Dillon has become a devoted and cherished supporter of Le Moyne College. Jack enjoyed a distinguished career at the International Monetary Fund and served on Le Moyne's board of trustees for 18 years, most notably as chair of the Investment Committee. His deep engagement with the College included delivering the Spring Madden Lecture in 2002, receiving the Distinguished Alumnus Award in 2013 and being awarded an honorary degree in 2020.

Helen actively supported Jack's philanthropy and service, frequently attending College events such as Founders' Day and alumni receptions in New York and Washington, D.C. Following Jack's passing in 2021, she honored his legacy by establishing the John T. (Jack) Boorman '63 Endowment for International Study, Travel or Volunteer Service - providing students with transformative global learning opportunities.

In 2023, Helen made another remarkable contribution by partnering with Michael Madden '71, with additional support from Dominick '76 and Rita Pullano, to create the John T. (Jack) Boorman '63 Endowed Chair in Business and Economics. This generous gift ensures Jack's passion for academic excellence and economics will continue to inspire and benefit generations of students.

Helen is a graduate of Marymount College in Tarrytown, New York, (now part of Fordham University). A lifelong international traveler and avid cyclist, she worked as a historian for the National Park Service in Washington, D.C., and later spent 25 years as a national account manager at AT&T, overseeing clients such as Marriott and the Federal Reserve. She has also shared her talents as an English as a second language teacher for immigrants.
